Abstract

The male of *Eupithecia cupressata* Pearsall is described, and illustrations of adults and genitalia of both sexes are provided.

Introduction

The poorly known *Eupithecia cupressata* Pearsall was described from a single reared female. Although identified as a male in the original description (Pearsall, 1910), McDunnough (1949) subsequently dissected the type and found it to be a female. He illustrated the specimen with partial genitalia. Only two other specimens, both females, were known to McDunnough. Herein I describe the male of *cupressata* and provide photographs of the adults and genitalia of both sexes.
