## A contribution to the Heptageniidae (Insecta, Ephemeroptera) of Thailand and Malaysia

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## Abstract

A brief survey of Heptageniidae (Ephemeroptera) from Thailand and Malaysia is presented. New for science are *Afronurus namnaoensis* **sp. nov.**, *Compsoneuria langensis* **sp. nov.**, *Epeorus inthanonensis* **sp. nov.**, *Epeorus (Belovius) khayengensis* **sp. nov.** and *Epeorus nguyenbaeorum* **sp. nov.**, from Thailand and *Compsoneuria perakensis* **sp. nov.** from Malaysia; the new species originate from rivers and streams in the north of Thailand and from some streams in peninsular Malaysia. For the first time, the male of *Asionurus primus* Braasch & Soldán, 1986 is described and a larva of supposed *Iron longitibius* Nguyen & Bae, 2004 is illustrated from Thailand. *Compsoneuria (Siamoneuria) kovaci* Braasch, 2006 was originally not adequately placed in *Compsoneuria* Eaton, 1881. Its true affiliation remains unclear. Supposed *Epeorus hieroglyphicus* Braasch & Soldán, 1984, redescribed by Nguyen and Bae (2004), is renamed to *Epeorus nguyenbaeorum* **sp. nov.** Two new findings of Heptageniidae are reported from Thailand: *Epeorus bifurcatus* Braasch & Soldán, 1979 and *Iron martinus* Braasch & Soldán, 1984. *Rhithrogeniella ornata* Ulmer, 1939 is recorded from Malaysia for the first time.

## Introduction

Recently, Braasch and Boonsoong (2009) commented on the generic situation in exploring the Heptageniidae (Ephemeroptera) from Thailand. Representatives of the genera *Notacanthurus* Tshernova, 1974 and *Rhithrogena* Eaton, 1881 were recorded the first time from the country (Braasch & Boonsoong 2009). Now, the updated list of Thailand Heptageniidae contains 15 species as follows: *Afronurus cervina* (Braasch & Soldán, 1984), *A. dama* (Braasch & Soldán, 1987), *A. gilliesiana* (Braasch, 1990), *A. rainulfiana* (Braasch, 1990), *A. rubromaculatus* (You, Wu, Gui & Hsu, 1981), *Asionurus primus* Braasch & Soldán, 1986, *Compsoneuria* (*C.) thienemanni* (Ulmer, 1939), *C. (Siamoneuria) kovaci* Braasch, 2006, *Epeorus aculeatus* Braasch, 1990, *E. (Belovius) unicornutus* Braasch, 2006, *Notacanthurus baei* Braasch & Boonsoong, 2009, *Rhithrogena siamensis* Braasch & Boonsoong, 2009, *Rhithrogeniella tonkinensis* Soldán & Braasch, 1986, *Thalerosphyrus sinuosus* (Navás, 1933) and *Trichogenia maxillaris* Braasch & Soldán, 1988.

Herein, we treat further material mostly originating from the northern and northeastern Thailand and a smaller number of Heptageniidae from mainland Malaysia. Ephemeroptera from the latter country were provided by Bishop (1973) having investigated the limnology of the small Gombak River. *Thalerosphyrus* Eaton, 1881 (sp. A, B + C), *Epeorus* Eaton, 1881 sp. A and *Compsoneuria* (sub nomine *Compsoneuriella* Ulmer, 1939) are cited among the Heptageniidae. Braasch and Soldán (1986b) checked the Heptageniidae from the former Bishop mayfly collections, made available by W.L. and J.G. Peters (Florida A & M University), Tallahassee, USA, and recorded *Epeorus hieroglyphicus* (Braasch & Soldán 1984), *Asionurus petersi, Compsoneuria flowersi* and *Thalerosphyrus bishopi* (Braasch & Soldán 1986a,b).

The aim of the present paper is to improve the knowledge of Heptageniidae from Thailand and Malaysia by describing new species and/or unknown stages, and providing comments regarding previously known species and new country records.
